Our church theme for 2010 is "Who Cares?" The reason for this theme is to understand that God is a caring God and as a result to encourage brothers and sisters to be involved in caring for one another ministry.

From a broader biblical perspective, we can see that the God we trust is a caring God. Partially quoting Francis Schaeffer, God is not silent, God is there, and I add, God does care too. In the earliest account in the Book of Genesis, we can see God cares for the creation, especially the first couple, Adam and Eve. (Genesis 1:8, 15) So, not only God cares for the man but also commissions the man to take care of the Garden of Eden. That is the reason for work. "The Lord God said, 'It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him'" (Genesis 1: 18) It is the reason for marriage and family. So, God cares for humanity and gives them work and marriage and family.

The above Bible verse is our choir's motto. It is with great privilege that we can use our voices and musical instruments to sing praises to our God during worship.

Our diverse backgrounds – some of us have a lot of experience in singing and musical training, and some of us have none. But with one voice and one heart, we want to praise our God! We all live in different parts of the Bay Areas – from San Francisco, Castro Valley to San Jose.

How we choose the music – The choir director is the main person choosing the music through prayer, meditation, and listening/learning the music. The music can be chosen depending on the seasons or theme of the month, e.g., Christmas, Thanksgiving, Mission, or Evangelistic meeting. A mixed of easy, intermediate and some difficult level of singing are chosen to help the choir practice and improve our singing skills. As a choir for the Cantonese, we strive to select Cantonese songs so that our congregation can appreciate the meaning of the songs; when we choose a song in other languages, we always provide Chinese translation of the lyrics to our congregation. The usage of instruments for accompaniment is also reviewed to make sure the piece has good harmony.

Practice, practice, more practice -- We present anthems every other week, but rehearsals are necessary every week (Wednesday night). Please pray for our continued commitment to learn to serve our Lord in this amazing ministry, our eagerness to learn, and our humble hearts to let God lead.
